Excerpt from Record Staff Writer reporter Roger Phillips, reporting on judge confirms approval of Stockton's bankruptcy plan.

Klein's (federal Judge Christopher Klein) harshest words in his written opinion were directed at the California Public Employees' Retirement System.

The pension giant argued Stockton would have faced a \$1.6 billion lien had it chosen to terminate its Cal PERS contract as part of its bankruptcy restructuring.

Klein determined the huge lien was not legally enforceable, providing a precedent for other cities considering attempting to escape CalPERS obligations. But the judge did not require Stockton to include CalPERS termination in its bankruptcy restructuring. In turn, the city opted to leave CalPERS untouched.

"CalPERS has bullied its way about in this case with an iron fist insisting that it and the municipal pensions it services are inviolable," Klein wrote. "The bully may have an iron fist, but it also turns out to have a glass jaw."

ESTATE PLANNING – GREGG HULTGREN By Tom McEachern

Mr. Hultgren gave a very informative talk about wills, trusts and inheritance. He is a practicing attorney specializing in the creation and administration of estate legal documents. He graduated from Pepperdine University School of Law and has been certified by the State Bar of California's Board of Legal Specialization as a specialist in the area of Estate Planning, Probate and Trust Law.

He covered many subjects during his appearance including: trusts, wills, power of attorney and advanced health care directives.

Some areas to be aware of on wills or trusts:

- 1. an older trust, more than 5 years old, should be reviewed for law changes
- 2. family situation changes or beneficiary changes, should also be reviewed after legal documents have been written. Some reasons for a change could include birth, death, marriage, divorce or other family situations
- 3. additional reasons for review could include special needs beneficiaries or changing health issues

If you have a trust, then protecting your assets by making and keeping them in the trust is <u>very important</u>. Assets may include: real estate, autos, art work, cash and brokerage accounts, life insurance policies, IRA's, safety deposit boxes, business interests and digital interests. Assets left out of a trust could be eligible for probate.

At the conclusion of Mr. Hultgren's presentation, there were more questions than he had time to address. There was expressed interest in having him appear again to address additional concerns of the members. RETIREMENT BOARD NEWS By Art Goulet

The roller coaster continues! In January, following a decline in December, the value of VCERA's assets dropped again in January to \$4.28 billion. The asset value rebounded in February and, by the end of the month, had increased to \$4.41 billion. However, it still appears that VCERA will be unable to earn its assumed rate of return of 7.75 % in the 2014-2015 fiscal year.

At its January 26th meeting, the Board of Retirement approved the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2014. The CAFR is available for review on VCERA's website. The Board also approved the audit report for the same fiscal year. There were no negative findings. Although the Annual Actuarial Valuation (AV) was submitted at the same meeting, it was necessary to continue consideration of it due to some identified amendments. The revised AV was subsequently approved at the Board's February 23rd meeting. The AV reported that the system's funded ratio had increased from 79.2% to 82.7% over the last fiscal year. Unfortunately, an error was discovered in the member contribution rates for the non-PEPRA tiers, so the AV, as corrected, will have to be approved at a subsequent Board meeting. After that approval, the AV should be available for review on the VCERA website in the near future.

At the February 23rd meeting, the Board of Retirement also determined that the change in CPI for the measurement period was 0.7%, which rounds to 0.5%. Because of existing COLA banks, Tier 1 and safety retirees who retired on or before April 1, 1982 will receive a 3% COLA in their retirement checks, and those who retired between that date and April 1, 1983 will receive 1.0%. Because there was no existing COLA bank for those Tier 1 and safety retirees who retired after April 1, 1983, they will only receive a COLA of 0.5%. These increases will be reflected in the April checks.

After reducing existing COLA banks to provide for the increases in excess of 0.5%, the remaining COLA banks for Tier 1 and safety retirees for 2015 will be:

On or before 4/1/75	52.0%
4/2/75 to 4/1/76	44.5%
4/2/76 to 4/1/77	37.0%
4/2/77 to 4/1/78	33.0%

4/2/80 to 4/1/81	17.0%
4/2/81 to 4/1/82	4.5%
4/2/82 or later	0.0%

Tier 2 retirees (who were represented by SEIU and who did not withdraw their COLA contributions upon retirement) will receive a 2% COLA for service accumulated after March 16, 2003 (or service accumulated after July 7, 2002 if they retired prior to 3/13/2005.)

At its March 16th meeting, the Board adopted the pensionable compensation limits for PEPRA members for 2015, as recommended by the California Actuarial Advisory Panel. The new limits are \$117,020 for members participating in Social Security, and \$140,424 for those members who are not (Safety Employees).

In addition, the Board approved new asset allocation targets, including the addition of new allocations to Global Tactical Asset Allocation and Private Debt.

Just for info, I have been nominated by the SACRS Nominating Committee for the position of SACRS Secretary. The election will be held at the May SACRS Spring Conference.
