Your REAVC Board had asked VCERA to delay implementation until the State Supreme Court renders its decision, but this request was not considered.

The legal costs to support REAVC's litigation effort have been considerable, and financial support is still needed. VCERA RETIREMENT BOARD NEWS – ART GOULET

August and September's investment results continued to move upward, with a 2.0% gain in August, bringing the Retirement System's portfolio value up to \$8.48 billion and 1.5% in September, bringing it to \$8.59 billion. So far, for the first quarter of the 24-25 fiscal year, preliminary earnings have been 4.9%.

The VCERA Board of Retirement (BoR) was dark for the month of August.

At its September 3rd meeting, the BoR committed an additional \$30 million to Harbourvest Partners Infrastructure Opportunities Fund III, bringing its commitment to that fund up to \$105 from the \$75 million it had committed in September 2023. In addition to this Harbourvest fund, the BoR has committed \$427.5 million to a variety of other Harbourvest funds.


At the same meeting, the BoR committed \$50 million to Arbour Lane Credit Opportunity Fund IV.

When it met on September 30th, the BoR committed \$100 million to Sculptor Real Estate Fund V.

The late September meeting was primarily a Retreat during which the BoR and Staff heard a couple of industry presentations as well as from two very new staff members, the Communications Officer and the Disability Manager, who explained any changes they were planning, as well as providing the BoR with insight into what their positions were responsible for.

After a fairly lengthy recruitment process, including the time it took to work with County HR to create a new classification and commensurate salary, VCERA has hired a new Investment Officer to support Chief Investment Officer Dan Gallagher in managing a growing and complex investment portfolio. Her name is Paris Ba, and she comes to VCERA from the San Joaquin County Employees' Retirement Association (SJCERA), where she was a Retirement Investment Officer. Prior to holding that position, she was employed as a Global Fixed Income Information Officer/Analyst at CalPERS. Paris earned a Master's Degree in Economics from UC Davis, and is a Chartered Financial Analyst.
